GRANTS

DG Lary Garrison has been extremely active in helping clubs get grants to help with their community service projects including the most recent grants to help Ennis, Seeley Lake, and Baker, DG Lary has a great grasp of the grant process and is willing to help clubs with their grant application. There is a tremendous amount of LCIF money available to help clubs through grant programs: Humanitarian Matching Grant (old Standard Grant), disaster relief (Emergency, Preparedness, Community Recovery, Major Catastrophe); Lions Quest, Diabetes, LEO, District & Club Sharing (old Core 4); a new grant that is just being developed, District and Club Sharing Grant.

Ennis Lions Club Successful Grant Application

The Ennis Lions Club was successful in obtaining an LCIF standard grant for approximately \$75,000.00. The grant provides funding for the expansion of the Ennis Senior Center which provides important services to local seniors as well as providing Meals on Wheels for the homebound of the surrounding area. The project also includes: (1) providing ADA

facilities in the parking area, and entrance/greeters station, (2) provides additional space for eye exams, routine health check-ups and financial/aging counseling (3) provides for more food and equipment storage to support the local hospital (4) improves heating, cooling and electrical systems; provides additional furnishing such as chairs and tables, shelving and improves exterior and interior lighting.

Whitefish Lions Club

Garden to School Lunch Program

The garden to school lunch program a cooperative project between the Whitefish Lions Club and the Whitefish school district.

An initial goal of the project was to teach children the link between what they eat, where the food comes from and the health benefits of good eating habits.

The project produces approximately 3000 pounds of fresh produce that goes directly into the school lunch program each harvest.

This original effort has blossomed into a \$2.1 million Center for Sustainability and Entrepreneurship (CSE) facility.

The CSE is a state-of-the-art, net zero facility that will include classrooms, laboratories, a greenhouse, energy systems, production gardens, orchards and an experimental forest. It will serve K-12 students as well as the community through adult learning classes.

“We’re working on getting a Leos Club up and running at the high school that would be in conjunction with the program.
